Objective: Learn the image element and add images to the mini-golf web site. Include a banner from flaming text and other images of mini golf you find with a search engine.

Be able to answer the following questions on the back of this page. You can then use this page for notes for quizzes and tests:

1. What two types of image formats do we use?
2. Where should we save our images?
3. What does the ALT attribute do in the image element?
4. What does the ALIGN attribute do in the image element?
5. How would we align an image so it is in the center of the page? (Hint – you don't use the ALIGN attribute with the IMG element.)

Exercise

Procedure:

1. Go to <http://www.flamingtext.com>. Create a banner heading for your mini golf course.
2. Save the graphic you created as banner or logo . gif or .jpg (whatever it is). Make sure you save it in your exercises folder, or the folder where your minigolf.htm is located.
3. Find your <h1> heading for your assignment and cut it out of your web page. Then enter the following code to show and center your image. <p align="center"> </p> REMEMBER --- if you named your banner something other than banner, and if it is not a gif image you must change that in your .
4. Re-save your mini- golf page.
5. View your page.
6. Make any corrections.
7. Go to a search engine and look for pictures of mini golf courses. Here is a great link: <http://www.harrisminigolf.com/gallery.htm> Save a couple of these pictures and put them in your web site.
8. Try using the ALIGN tag in the IMG element to see how the text wraps around the image. Try border and height and width attributes.
9. Save your page and view the results.
